Course Description:

This course focuses on applications of various media technologies to design and produce the college yearbook and material for the local cable television channel.

Course Competencies:

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Use digital cameras (including the use of manual settings) to produce high quality images.
- 2. Write copy that is correct in grammar, usage, sentence structure, and spelling.
- 3. Edit and proofread effectively to produce copy that is organized, clear, accurate, and interesting for its intended purpose and audience.
- 4. Function as an active team member in creating an effective layout and design for the college yearbook.
- 5. Use advanced features of Photoshop software to enhance images.

Course Content:

- A. Advanced photo editing
- B. Using digital camera manual settings
- C. Teamwork to create, design, and schedule yearbook production
- D. Photographing college events and activities
- E. Creating, editing, and proofing yearbook pages
- F. Creating pages and video for cable television channel

Learning Assessments:

Course competencies will be assessed by class participation, meeting of deadlines, completion of assigned tasks, layout and design effectiveness, and yearbook and television production work.
