
**Donnelly College requirements:**

1. Completion of required coursework with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher;
2. Completion of at least 39 hours of prescribed major course with a grade of C or better;
3. Completion of at least 124 college-level credit hours;
4. Completion of at least 45 prescribed upper-division credit hours;
5. Completion of at least 30 credit hours at Donnelly College and 24 of the last 30 hours earned from Donnelly College;
6. Satisfactory completion of a mathematics course with Intermediate Algebra as its prerequisite;
7. *(\*)* Students must complete one course that satisfies the **U.S. Constitution** requirement. The student may use one of their required Humanities or Social Science to meet this requirement;
8. *(\*\*)* Students must complete one course that satisfies the **Non-Western Civilization** requirement. The student may use one of their required humanities or social science courses to meet this requirement;
9. Satisfactory completion of two sciences courses with a laboratory, or satisfactory completion of two math courses with Intermediate Algebra as a prerequisite, or the completion of two computer programming language courses; and
10. Satisfactory completion of an upper-division religion course.




