## **Donnelly College requirements:**

- 1. Completion of required coursework with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher;
- 2. Completion of at least 39 hours of prescribed major course with a grade of C or better;
- 3. Completion of at least 124 college-level credit hours;
- 4. Completion of at least 45 prescribed upper-division credit hours;
- 5. Completion of at least 30 credit hours at Donnelly College and 24 of the last 30 hours earned from Donnelly College;
- 6. Satisfactory completion of a mathematics course with Intermediate Algebra as its prerequisite;
- 7. (\*) Students must complete one course that satisfies the U.S. Constitution requirement. The student may use one of their required Humanities or Social Science to meet this requirement;
- 8. (\*\*) Students must complete one course that satisfies the Non-Western Civilization requirement. The student may use one of their required humanities or social science courses to meet this requirement;
- Satisfactory completion of two sciences courses with a laboratory, or satisfactory completion of two math courses with Intermediate Algebra as a prerequisite, or the completion of two computer programming language courses; and
- 10. Satisfactory completion of an upper-division religion course.
