

Highland Community College's Concurrent Program provides area Kansas schools with the opportunity to expand their curriculum by scheduling HCC courses in conjunction with their regular class offerings. Students have the advantage of taking their college classes right at the high school during the day. Classes are transferable to most colleges in Kansas.

Program Overview

Students learn first-hand the demands of going to college; they experience the process of enrolling in college classes and the costs associated with college tuition, fees, and textbooks. The Concurrent Program eases a student's transition from high school to college and provides academic enrichment to students who are ready for the challenge of college coursework. Students who choose college while in High School make considerable progress toward their college education if the appropriate time and focus are given to their studies.
