Course Description:

This course provides a basic study of law related to business. Emphasis will be on contracts, law of sales, negotiable instruments, consumer protection, and the Uniform Commercial Code (UCC).

Course Competencies:

- 1. Explain the principal source of the law.
- 2. Describe in general terms the court system and litigation procedure.
- 3. Identify principal crimes and torts and describe their elements.
- 4. Explain the elements of a contract.
- 5. Contrast and compare the UCC with common law as it applies to sales law.
- 6. Describe the laws of warranties, product liability, and consumer protection.
- 7. Explain consumer protection law as it relates to business and consumer transactions.

Guidelines for Requesting Accommodations Based on Documented Disability or Medical Condition
