Course Description:

This course provides a keyboard study of melodies, scales, harmonies, meters, and rhythm.

Course Competencies:

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate basic keyboard skills with regard to scales, intervals, meters, and rhythm.
- 2. Demonstrate advancement in keyboarding skills.
- 3. Accurately transcribe simple melodies, harmonic progressions, and rhythms by ear.
- 4. Play scales in major, natural minor, harmonic minor, and melodic minor.

Course Content:

 - 1. Major
 - 2. Minor (including natural, harmonic, and melodic variants)
- B. Rhythmic Dictation
 - 1. Simple and Compound Meters
 - 2. Division of Beat
- C. Melodic Dictation
 - 1. Intervals
 - 2. Arpeggiated Triads
- D. Harmonic Transcription
 - 1. Tonic Triad
 - 2. Dominant Chords
 - 3. Sub-Dominant Chords
- E. Basic Musical Analysis

Course competencies will be assessed by use of quizzes and exams, class exercises, and class participation.
