Course Description:

This course provides additional instruction in functional keyboard skills needed to succeed in the music classroom or play the piano for personal enjoyment.

Course Competencies:

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Explain basic keyboard concepts, such as basic note and rest values, names of white keys and octaves, dynamic signs, sharps, flats, naturals, treble clef, bass clef, Grand Staff, time signatures, tempo marks, and articulation.
- 2. Explain intervals, major and minor keys, modes, chromatic, whole tone, and blues scales.
- 3. Display basic skills in sight-reading, harmonization, improvisation, and ensemble activities.

Course Content:

- A. Scales
- B. Etudes
- C. Various styles for practice and performance
- D. Basic music theory
- E. Solo literature at various levels of difficulty
- F. Styles of music for study or performance

Learning Assessments:

Course competencies will be assessed by attendance, class participation, written or oral practice reports, progress, mid-term recital, and juried final performance.
