Message from the President.....

I hope you'll enjoy this issue of *The HCC Connection* and it inspires you to attend the Alumni Reunion this spring. Many changes have taken place since last April and I know you'll have a good feeling about your alma mater after visiting campus.

Here are a few highlights:

- The Stadium Center is complete except for some landscaping outside the building.
- The new Wellness Center is under construction and the anticipated completion date is late September 2005.
- · Our Title III Strengthening Institutions Grant has had a tremendous impact on our campus as we are in the second year of that project.
- · MS-1, our lecture hall in the Math Science building, has been transformed into a videoconferencing classroom.
- Two regional centers have been relocated to better connect with our students.



· Two alumni gifts benefit Theatre, Music, and Library.

Work on the HCC Master Facilities Plan continues with the completion of the Stadium Center in December and construction of the Wellness Center is underway. The football and track coaching staffs have moved into the Stadium Center. On the second floor, in addition to office space, there is a large game administration area, rest rooms, and a conference room. Downstairs houses a concession stand, public rest rooms for athletic events, and the Dean Barber Memorial Room. This building is a great addition to our campus and makes Kessinger Field and Track one of the best venues in the state to watch community college football and track.

The Wellness Center construction is on target with the steel frame currently being erected. This 41,000 square foot facility will provide recreational space for our students, faculty, staff, and community; an area for activity classes, a large space for campus and



community events, and an indoor practice area for track, softball, and baseball during inclement weather. You may also follow the construction of the Wellness Center with our webcam at www.highlandcc.edu

Employees of our Title III grant are busy revamping our developmental curriculum. They have converted nine of our regular classrooms into SMART classrooms and have held boot camps to train faculty in new technology, skills, and delivery methods effective with high-risk, under-prepared students.



They have established a "Summer Blitz" program to provide developmental students a jump start on their fall classes. Learning communities are being developed as faculty team-teach such linked courses as: Reading Skills and Fundamentals of English, English I and Fundamentals of Investigation, and Macro Economics and General Sociology.

Last summer, the old seating in the MS-1 lecture hall was removed and new table style seating was installed. The tables are wired so students may have use of laptop computers while in class. During semester break, videoconferencing equipment was installed. The equipment was the result of a Rural Utilities Services (RUS) grant HCC received by

classroom space. We continue to offer our curriculum to the Atchison area, and twenty-three NEKTC students also are pursuing an associate's degree this spring by enrolling in our general education classes. NEKTC has been a good partner to HCC and we hope to build on this relationship in the future.

This year, HCC moved our Frankfort operations to Marysville. We anticipate this move will better serve the population of in the northwest corner of our service area.

Two alumni gifts this year will enable us to make significant strides in three areas. The first was a gift from the estate of Mildred Myers (class of 1946). This gift was used to purchase and install a new lighting system in



partnering with some local high schools. HCC is offering 14 interactive video classes this spring over the Telenet 2 network.

Highland Community College has moved our Atchison operations to the Northeast Kansas Technical College campus. NEKTC has been kind enough to offer us office and Culbertson Auditorium last summer. In addition to acting, HCC has students interested in technical theatre. This new state-of-the-art lighting system will allow our technical theatre students to transfer to other theatre programs with excellent experience in theatre lighting.

The second gift, donated in the memory of Ruth Kieswetter (class of 1927), has been earmarked for the Library and music department. We are still establishing what the gift will be specifically used for, and there is no shortage of need in either area.

Alumni support was generous last year and it's vital that it continue. Our main sources of revenue do little more than provide the basics for our operation. Enhancements to our campus and programs depend on strong alumni support. We couldn't have accomplished many of the good things we do without your interest, participation, and contributions. When I visit with alums, who graduated some time ago, or when I talk to recent graduates, I hear the same thing being said. "HCC gave me an opportunity for higher education that I wouldn't have had otherwise."

Come back to campus and see us. I know you'll be impressed and we'll enjoy showing you around. With that being said, I challenge you to:

Proceeds from registration and the concession stand help support alumni activities and scholarships.


