Course Description:

This course provides an introduction to the principles and practices of summer theatre productions. The course will cover preparation, rehearsal, and performance of college productions and will emphasize the special problems of acting, directing, and managing technical aspects for summer theatre.

Course Competencies:

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

1. Function effectively in the shortened rehearsal period of summer theatre.
2. Function as an effective production team member in a performance or technical role for one or more summer theatrical performances.
3. Evaluate performances through audience response and critique sessions.

Course Content:

- A. Preparation and performance of dramatic productions
- B. Designing and executing sets, costumes, properties, lighting, and make-up
- C. Management and promotion
- D. Rehearsal techniques

Learning Assessments:

Course competencies will be assessed by class attendance, participation, completion of performance or production tasks as assigned, performance critiques, and self-critiques.

Instructional Materials:

Play scripts, research and other materials determined by the instructor.
