HIS103 History of Western Civilization I 3 Hours Studies the development of western culture and institutions from the ancient world. Study of great civilizations of the Ancient Near East, Greece, and Rome. Emphasis on political, social, religious, and cultural life. Also covers the rise of Christianity, the end of the Roman Empire, and Medieval Europe to the Renaissance. HIS104 History of Western Civilization II 3 Hours Covers the history of early Modern Europe from the late Renaissance/Reformation to the present. The spiritual, intellectual, social, political, and economic foundations are examined. Emphasis on new and revolutionary social movement, the development of national institutions, and the breakdown of the old diplomatic order.
