KANSAS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

HCC's programs offer the opportunity to expand your horizons and market ability in any field you enjoy. All of HCC's courses are taught with common course content, regardless of delivery format. HCC provides a wide variety of courses which can be used as transferable credit or towards degree completion. Courses are available in fall, spring, and summer sessions.

High school juniors and seniors can also take advantage of select free tuition courses through Excel in CTE. In an effort to jump start the workforce, Kansas' Career and Technical Education Act adopted Senate Bill 155, allows high school Juniors and Seniors to enroll in Technical Education programs and selected courses tuition free.

CONCURRENT

Highland's Concurrent Program provides area Kansas high schools with the opportunity to expand their curriculum by scheduling HCC courses in conjunction with their normal class offerings. Students have the advantage of taking college courses at high school during the regular school day. Students learn first-hand the demands of the college classroom. The Concurrent Program experience eases a students' transition from high school to college and provides academic enrichment to students.

TECHNICAL & ALLIED HEALTH

CAMPUS & REGIONAL

HCC Campus & Regional Centers offer daytime, evening, and weekend course options. Regional locations include Atchison, Baileyville, Perry, and Wamego. Some communities also offer summer and evening courses. Small class sizes allow for personal attention from caring instructors. Students enrolling in Excel in CTE courses are only responsible for textbook rental fees*.

HCC ONLINE

HCC Online provides flexible learning opportunities for students through structured Moodle classrooms. Self-motivated students are able to complete online courses at the location and time of day that works best for them. Instructors lead students through the course curriculum using presentations, online resources, discussion boards, written assignments, and assessments.

Course activities must be completed by the posted deadlines. Online math courses require test proctoring. Students enrolling in online Excel in CTE classes are responsible for paying the book rental fee*.
