Course Description:

An introduction to ethical theory focusing on the major traditions of Western philosophical ethics and their practical application to contemporary moral issues.

Course Competencies:

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

1. Recognize the significance of moral philosophy in a broader context.
2. Recognize key characteristics of philosophical inquiry such as its emphasis on careful reasoning and analysis and how it differs from other kinds of inquiry.
3. Identify and explain basic ethical theories, terminology and concepts.
4. Identify and develop in writing philosophical analyses and arguments based on philosophical reasoning and provide cogent reasons in support of competing philosophical claims.
5. Evaluate in writing philosophical arguments and texts focusing on moral theories and problems, and state alternative points of view by, providing their own positions supported by cogent arguments.
6. Apply ethical theory to contemporary issues and problems.

- A. Ethical Theories of Major Western Philosophical Traditions
- B. Application of Moral Theory to Contemporary Issues

Learning Assessments:

Course competencies may be assessed by class participation, documented written commentaries on the reading assignments, quizzes, and exams.
