Be Prepared for the End of the Semester

It is that time of year that everyone looks forward to, but also has some trepidation about- Finals are Coming!!! Having a good study plan can keep you on track and keep your mind at ease as we finish out the semester. Here are some tips:

Organize Your Time Get a planner or calendar to mark down your classes and assignments.

Create a "To-Do" list of things and events that need to be completed. Mark down all other important events (don't

forget packing!!).
Use Your Study Time Productively

Make sure you know what kind of final your classes require. It is a chapter test? Is it a cumulative a plan to estady for a paper due? A project?

Make a plan to study for a reasonable amount of time. Cramming does not work! Spread out your studying over several days, not just the night before.

Stick to Your Plan

Choose a quiet, distraction free place to study Bring your To-Do list and planner to stay on ťráck.

Practice! Quiz yourself or a friend. If you can't explain how you got the answer or the reasoning behind a process, then you don't understand it enough.

Review your textbooks and notes. Revisit what you have highlighted or noted.

Transfer Advice!

Is it too late to transfer? While it is best to make a decision on where you will be transferring early in the semester, there is still time to get admitted.

The first step is to look at transfer requirements. After looking at requirements, it's time to get busy and begin the application process.

Go to the schools website and apply online. Send official college transcripts from each college you've attended. If you have over 24 hours of college credit you will no longer need to submit a high school transcript or ACT scores.

Check in with admissions to make sure everything has been received.

Will they accept all transfer credits? If a course isn't accepted and you think it should be, you can then send in a course syllabus for further evaluation.

Add the new school's financial aid code onto your FAFSA.

Where will you live? Apply online for campus housing or begin searching for off campus housing.

Meet with an advisor to enroll for courses at your new school.
ASK QUESTIONS!!

Transfer requirements can vary at each school, so it's very important to read each email the university sends to you. They will send step by step directions on what to do and it is your responsibility to read each one and ask questions if you don't understand.
